Our beaches

From the huge expanse of Camber sands to lowtide rock pools at Pett Level, the beaches around here have something for everyone. How do you want to see the sea and soothe your soul today?



<u>Short</u> <u>Gallivants</u>

CAMBER SANDS (0 MILES)

Across the road from the Gallivant. Walk straight ahead and over the sand dune. You have arrived.

Beach type

Golden sand & dunes

Dog friendly

Yes, all year round but in the summer to the right only.

Overview

Camber Sands is the biggest sandy beach in the South East of England, with one of the longest stretches of sand dunes in England. If you want the picture-perfect beach with rolling sand dunes, then this is top of the list.

Tips

Camber is one of the best places for learning to kitesurf and windsurf in the country with a vast expanse of waist-deep water extending out for about a mile into the sea, and a very consistent shore breeze. We can put you in touch with the right guys to take a lesson, just ask.

RYE HARBOUR BEACH (7 MILES)

Only 15 mins drive away, with plenty of parking. Head to the car park at the end of Harbour Road. The beach is down the path that runs alongside the river Rother.

Beach type

Sand low tide/shingle high tide.

Dog friendly Yes

Overview

An expansive beach just a 5-minute bike ride down the river estuary (10 mins by foot). The path runs directly alongside the river with fields of samphire on your left and the Nature Reserve on your right. When you get to the beach, past the old pill box and famous black and red cottage, depending on what the tide is doing you will either see a shingle beach at high tide or an enormous expanse of sand at low tide as far as you can see.

Tips

Because there isn't any car access, the beach is ALWAYS virtually empty and is a great place to while away the day, with a picnic and a good book. Those in the know like swimming here at high tide as the shingle absorbs the suns energy and heats the water as it comes in. In land is an incredible nature reserve (bring some binoculars) with purpose built hides overlooking salt marsh lagoons. The whole area is criss crossed with paths, all accessible by bike and if you keep heading west you'll eventually get to Pett Level.

PETT LEVEL (11 MILES)

Probably the most deserted stretch of beach in the area.

Beach type Sand/shingle

Dog Friendly

Yes, except from May 1st to 30th September.

Overview

A continuation of Rye Harbour Beach, so there is shingle at high tide and sand at low. As you move inland, there is an eclectic line of cottages and shacks known as 'the Ridge' locally.

Pett Level ends as the Fairlight Cliffs begin. A small and peaceful seaside village situated on the coast between Rye and Hastings, it is famous for its petrified fossil forest which dates back to the last ice age. It lies alongside a sea defence wall built in the 1940's, where you can go for a long walk with views of the sea, beach and cliffs.

Tips

There is easy parking alongside the Smugglers pub in the village. We would recommend going at low tide where the sea exposes some great rock pools full of winkles, immature whelks and sea anemones. Bring old shoes, as the rocks can get muddy.

Eat and drink

Of course, we think the best food is to be had right here. But there's more to the area. And quite a few places share our food values: great local produce, well-cooked, and served in a relaxed space. Others have a charm all of their own.





Most of the fish that's landed in Rye comes through here, with most of it going straight out to France and Spain. Russell keeps some back and sells it to the locals, but it does tend to sell out quickly on the weekends. He smokes his own fish and it's excellent.

VERY CLOSE (UP TO 4 MILES):

RYE OLD TOWN

Overview

The word 'Rye' means 'island'. Today the town remains almost entirely encircled by rivers – The Rother, Brede and Tillingham. In the wake of the Norman Conquest the town was occupied by the French until 1247 when it was reclaimed by Henry III. It was transformed into one of his heavily fortified Cinque Ports – a series of safe harbours ringing this stretch

a series of safe harbours ringing this stretch of coastline that repelled further attacks from across the Channel and consolidated England's maritime powers.

Tips

Head to the top of the hill by the church. Streets are still cobbled and it feels like you are in your very own Dickensian novel.

RYE HERITAGE CENTRE

Overview

The Rye Heritage Centre is a good place to find information on the local area. There's an 'Old Pier Penny' arcade and one of the largest collections of antique models and novelty games which once lined the piers and amusement arcades of the British seaside.

Overview

The Rye Castle museum is split across two sites in Rye. The East Street site is home to a fascinating selection of artefacts found in and around the area, but the real excitement lies at the Ypres Tower. Believed to have been built in the 13th century, the tower stood for centuries as a medieval prison, before becoming the town morgue. The tower took damage during air raids in World War II but has since been repaired and restored to its former glory and is ready to tell the tale of its past to those who visit.

Tips

When visiting the Tower, make sure to take a stroll around the Gun Gardens with its medieval cannons and views across the marsh and out to sea. Then head next door to The Ypres Castle Inn, a 17th century pub offering a selection of local cask ales and ciders, known by the locals as "The Wipers".

MARTELLO TOWER

Overview

Number of locations along the south coast. Originally 103 towers were built between 1805 and 1812 to resist a potential invasion by Napoleon. They were built of brick, 13 foot thick on the seaward side, stood about 30 foot high and were equipped with a cannon on the roof. 45 of the towers still remain, but many are in ruins or have been converted, so only 9 remain in their original condition. Two supporting forts were built on the south coast at Dymchurch and Eastbourne.

Tips

The tower at Dymchurch (No. 24) has been fully restored and is now a museum.

CHURCH OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Overview

A mystical 'deserted' castle in the middle of the fields a mile or so from the sea. Originally built by Henry VIII in 1539 as a coastal fort to repel the French, it was abandoned some 80 years later as the seas started to retreat. As a consequence it never got updated. A great halfway spot to have a picnic, there is a path directly from the harbour to the castle. Guided walks on various dates, there is a small charge for entry (£2 adults, £1 concessions, accompanied children free). Free to members of English Heritage and FRIENDS of the Nature Reserve. Located in Rye Harbour, but not accessible by car, so you must go by foot or by bike only, passing the church to your left.

DEREK JARMAN'S PROSPECT COTTAGE

Dungeness, next to the Power Station

Overview

Derek Jarman was one of the most influential figures in 20th Century British culture and bought this ramshackle cottage in 1986, transforming the garden and cottage into a sanctuary of art and imagination. It became a place for collaborations with fellow artists and after his death in 1994, a site of pilgrimage for art students, architects and garden designers. It was recently saved following a £3.5m fundraising campaign.



DUNGENESS AND THE OLD LIGHTHOUSE

Overview

This whole area is remarkable for its sense of space and light. A simply unique location, loved by artists, film makers and fashion shoots. The collection of shacks and houses, some of them fashioned from old railway carriages, festoon of shingles as if placed there by a giant's hand. We would strongly recommend visiting here during your stay, whatever the weather. In a howling storm, it's almost more interesting as you really see it in its element. Sitting as the centre piece to this wild landscape lies the lighthouse, which you can climb to get a panoramic view of all around.

RSPB DUNGENESS NATURE RESERVE

Another amazing reserve similar to the one in Rye Harbour but possibly even more dramatic, jutting out into the English Channel. Fantastic visitors centre with a huge picture window looking out on to one of the large gravel pits – a great place to be in the middle of winter! There are nature trails that criss-cross the reserve with a series of hides to view the birds unseen.

LADE PITS & DENGE SOUND MIRRORS

Overview

Lade Pits is a unique site for history as well as wildlife, as it contains three Scheduled Ancient Monuments, which are of international significance. The Denge Sound Mirrors (also known as the Acoustic Mirrors or Listening Ears) are three concrete structures which range in size from 20 to 200 feet. They were built between 1928 and 1935 as part of Britain's national defence strategy. The low-lying Romney Marsh was well suited for the placement of the Mirrors which were designed as early warning systems to pick up the sounds of approaching enemy aircraft coming over the English Channel. But the innovative technology was soon superseded by the invention of radar before the start of World War II. However, time spent constructing the Sound Mirrors was not wasted, as the technology used to create these led to developments of other aircraft detection systems.

Tips

There is no car parking on site, so please use the public car parks on the seafront (Coast Drive/ The Parade). Special events, where you can get closer to the Sound Mirrors are run throughout the year. An open day is run annually in the summer. Guided tours and photography days are run between August and December.



RH&D RAILWAY

Overview

The Romney, Hythe and Dymchurch Railway is an extraordinary steam railway line but in perfect miniature. First opened to traffic in July 1927 as the 'World's Smallest Public Railway' it covers a distance of 13.5 miles from the picturesque Cinque Port of Hythe, near the channel tunnel, to the fisherman's cottages and lighthouses at Dungeness. We would strongly recommend trying to take the 'Glady's' car as this has the only bar on the service and it's great fun trundling along while sipping a drink – call them ahead to see what time it is running.

WORTH THE TRIP (5 TO 10 MILES):

WINCHELSEA VILLAGE TN36

Overview

Claimed to be the smallest town in Britain, Winchelsea was founded in 1288 by Edward I and lies approximately 2 miles from Rye. Many buildings in the town are Grade I or Grade II listed. Built on the site of a medieval town, it's a hidden delight for visitors to discover, but also home to an active modern community. A 15-minute drive towards Hastings.

CELLAR TOURS

Overview

Situated on the dramatic seafront of Europe's oldest fishing beach, Hastings Contemporary champions modern and contemporary art with a bold and ambitious exhibition programme, showing works by historically important and internationally renowned artists, and emerging practitioners, as well as exploring the rich cultural history of artists from the South East.

HASTINGS SHIPWRECK MUSEUM

Overview

This free entry museum is one of Hasting's hidden gems. Located in the Old Town, overshadowed somewhat by its more wellknown neighbour the Blue Reef Aquarium, this site is home to a fascinating treasure trove of shipwreck artefacts and local fossils, (including a fossilised dinosaur footprint). Hear the tales of several wrecks lying beneath the waves of the English Channel including that of the Amsterdam, a large Dutch East Indiaman which was run ashore in January 1749 just 3 miles down the road at Bulverhythe. A few times a year, when the tide is low enough, the Shipwreck Museum hosts guided tours to the wreck as it can be seen protruding from the sand.

Tips

Take a stroll around Hastings Old Town and you will find an incredible selection of pubs and restaurants, most notably The Crown for a delicious menu featuring incredible vegetarian and vegan options, Porters Wine Bar for a cosy atmosphere with an open fire and exposed beams or if you like the high chance of stumbling upon a jamming session composed of local folk musicians, the Jenny Lind is the perfect spot for you.

GREAT DIXTER HOUSE AND GARDEN

Overview

Visit Great Dixter, the home of Christopher Lloyd, a famous gardener, designer and prolific writer of gardening books. Built in the middle of the 15th Century and restored and enlarged by Sir Edwin Lutyens, Great Dixter is both a historic house and family home of Christopher Lloyd who devoted his lifetime to creating one of the most experimental, exciting gardens of our time. The gardens are beautiful and they have a terrific garden centre on site with most of the plants being grown on site. Open March to October. Countless series of excellent events, we're big fans.

BATTLE ABBEY

Overview

On 14 October 1066 an army of invading Normans defeated the English at the Battle of Hastings in East Sussex. Now the whole family can discover the exciting story of that fateful day at the very place it happened. A major recent exhibition uses film, computer technology and interactive exhibits to bring to life this bloodiest of conflicts. Enjoy the new audio tour of the 100-acre battlefield, stand on the very spot where King Harold was slain and explore the ruins of the atmospheric abbey, built by William the Conqueror to commemorate the thousands who died. It is a great day out for the whole family.

BODIAM CASTLE

Bodiam, Robertsbridge, TN32 5UA

Overview

This 14th Century moated castle is just 30 minute's drive from the Gallivant and is the closest you will get in real life to a castle pulled from the pages of a story book. Walk around this magnificent site and gaze upon the perfect reflection in its moat, before heading across the narrow bridge and under the portcullis to the wonders inside.

Tips

Bodiam Castle is a National Trust site however a public footpath runs through the grounds if you wish to view the outside of the Castle as you ramble around the local countryside. When it's time for refreshments, the Castle Inn is a stone's throw from the castle, or half a mile up the road is The Hub; a beautifully thought out café, spa and community-based hub of activity.
